Giving Hope and Annual Appeal Garner Record-Setting Support



Faith Community Homes will be able to assist several more families and expand services in 2018 thanks to the tremendous response of its supporters. The *Giving Hope* fundraiser, held on September 24 at the Metropolis Ballroom in Arlington Heights, netted a record \$62,000+ for the organization and the families that it assists. The annual appeal, mailed out to past donors and event attendees on December 1, surpassed the budgeted goal by more than 60%.

The Giving Hope event included appetizers, raffles, a silent auction and entertainment by comedian Brian

Hicks, followed by headliner Rocky LaPorte of "Comedy Central" fame. It also featured two of the families in the program sharing their stories of challenge and success. The personal accounts were followed by a "Funds for Families" auction-style appeal through which event participants committed to funding additional families in 2018.

The substantial donations received through the two events allows the organization to expand its services to begin funding education and training for parents with a goal of preparing them for better, higher paying jobs. "The wonderful generosity of our supporters will have a direct and meaningful impact on the lives of the families we serve," says Jim Mayer, Board Chair of Faith Community Homes. "The additional funds will be critical to helping our families achieve higher levels of employability and income."

In 2017, FCH served 25 families through rental housing financial support, mentoring and other support services. A total of 10 families graduated from the program, all of whom are in a better position now than when they came into the program.

Volunteer Spotlight


In each newsletter, we will feature volunteers who have an impact on the success of Faith Community Homes. In this issue, we recognize the volunteers who oversee the food pantry.

Family Accomplishments

We are happy to share with you some of the accomplishments you have helped families achieve through your generous support of FCH (names changed for privacy purposes):

Diane and Sam are amazed at how great it feels to be able to responsibly make all bill payments on time and in full – on their own. For the two years they have been with FCH, they were very cooperative with their mentors, enjoyed learning and trying new ideas that were suggested to them, were trained for betterpaying jobs, and steadily increased their savings. They express their gratitude for all the help, support and guidance they received through FCH.

As a CNA at Adolorata Villa, Julie continues to take classes at Harper to advance in the medical field. The balance of working and school has been difficult but she is determined to succeed. She is taking steps to pay off her debt. To date, she has paid off two credit card bills, and continues to significantly increase her savings.

Angelica is completing her nursing rotations at Good Shepherd Hospital, and will graduate as an RN in February. She will then work full-time in the hospital as a Pediatric Nurse. For the past two years she has

been motivated to complete her studies in a field she loves, while continuing to be the good, involved, nurturing mother that she holds as her highest value. She is succeeding very well in both.

Upon completion of two advanced levels of certification in the welding field, George has almost doubled his income and is much more financially stable. His family is enjoying the difference this makes for all of them – less stress, more joy, and great pride and gratitude.

Ann has a new job after a year-long job search. She is now working for Sears Home Services and is enjoying the professional nature of her work. Her debt is cleared and her savings is on the rise. Her son is also working and now attends Harper College.

Kathy and Edwin financially "crashed" a few years ago. He lost his business, and soon after, their home. It has been an upward struggle for them since then. They are working hard to rebuild their lives. They have paid off a significant amount of debt, and he is re-starting his business. FCH has reached out a hand that helps them reach up in hope and confidence again.

Executive Director's Message

This past year has been busy and energizing for us here at Faith Community Homes. In 2017, we worked with 25 families, comprised of 32 adults and 44 children. While our dedicated staff and volunteer mentors have kept very busy, great strides have been made in helping families stay on course. We are grateful for the community financial support that provides us with the needed resources to successfully work with our families. The generosity of so many people has given us renewed inspiration and enthusiasm to serve our neighbors in need.

But the year has not been without challenges. The most significant challenge has been the rapid increase in area apartment rental costs while wages for our families have remained generally flat. While not a unique problem to Arlington Heights and Palatine, we are currently working on new initiatives that have the objective of increasing family members' education and skills development that will eventually

lead to better paying jobs. It remains, however, a difficult balancing act for families as they endeavor to remain employed, care for their children, and attend classes and/or training to improve their employment situations.

As always, we are optimistic that the families we serve will continue to advance their lives successfully. Through your continued financial support, we hope and anticipate that we will be able to assist more and more families to improve their lives in a march toward financial stability.
